

What exactly is a Goldendoodle?

First-generation Goldendoodles are a crossbreed between a Poodle and a Golden Retriever, known as F1. Breeding a Goldendoodle with a Poodle will give you an F1b.

Both Poodles and Golden Retrievers are popular dogs for their distinct features, and the goal of breeding them together is to combine their positive qualities to produce a dog that is beautiful, smart, and playful. Goldendoodles are very intelligent which makes them easy to train.

Due to the popularity of this breed, it seems like everyone has jumped on the Doodle bandwagon. It can all be a bit confusing as you see Bernedoodles (Bernese Mountain Dog and a Poodle), Sheepadoodles (Sheep Dog and a Poodle), and many more crossbreeds created.

They are all adorable and unique, however, in this book, we will focus solely on Goldendoodles, as we are a bit bias.

What size is a Goldendoodle?

It's pretty remarkable how the same dog breed can be as light as 15 pounds or more than 100 pounds. Goldendoodles grow up to be multiples sizes, depending on the size of the parents.

There are mini Goldendoodles, who are usually under 30 pounds, medium-sized Goldendoodles who are roughly under 45 pounds, and standard-sized Goldendoodles which apply to those over 55 pounds. Goldendoodles can get quite large. The largest Goldendoodle that has been reported is over 100 pounds. That's a lot of Doodle!

A small Goldendoodle is produced by breeding a Golden Retriever with a miniature Poodle while medium Goldendoodles are a cross between a Golden Retriever with smaller Poodles to create a variety of different size dogs. A large Goldendoodle is a cross between a standard Poodle and a Golden Retriever.
